

And for the first time in 20 years, you can walk on **Dunston Staiths** – **Friday 12th** from **12.00–16.00**, **Saturday 13th** from **10.30–15.30** and **Sunday 14th** from **10.30–15.30**. For more information visit **www.heritageopendays.org.uk**

Dunston Staiths on the River Tyne is believed to be the largest timber structure in Europe. At its height, 5.5m tonnes of coal a year was taken by rail from the Durham coalfields and loaded from the Staiths onto waiting ships on the river. Since its closure, it has fallen into decline, but now with the help of Heritage Lottery funding, TWBPT plans to make it into a sustainable visitor attraction.

Where available, postcodes have been provided to allow you to use SatNav or the Internet to find the buildings, or events. Use public transport if you can. BENWELL St James' Church

Benwell Lane NE15 6RR

St James' Church was originally designed by John Dobson and opened in 1833. The church and graveyard offer a fascinating insight into the history of an area which was once home to such illustrious people as Richard Grainger, John Buddle and John Sowerby. On Friday there will be a talk on 'Benwell Stories: Murder, Marriage and Other Tales' by Olive Taylor. On Saturday there will be a talk on 'Historic Churches: Their Use and Re-use' by Cyril Winskell, and a guided tour of the church and graveyard. New this year: 'Exploring our Past, Present and Future in Felt' – an exhibition of felting pictures created by the local community. Children's Trail available.



The hall is still in use by active masonic orders including Craft Masonry, Chapter, Mark and Women's Order. The Lodge Room is original and dates from 1870. GOSFORTH Friends' Meeting House

West Avenue NE3 4ES

The original building was designed by architects Hicks and Charlewood in 1898 as a men's club in the Queen Anne style. In 1922 the building was extended and was opened as a Masonic Lodge in 1925. The building was acquired by the Newcastle upon Tyne Local Meeting of The Religious Society of Friends in 2011 and converted to the new Quaker Meeting House for Newcastle upon Tyne. JESMOND Jesmond Dene Real Tennis Club

Grade II listed building. Victorian Real Tennis court built in what was then the garden of Jesmond Dene House in 1894. One of about 25 Real Tennis courts in the UK. In daily use by members of Jesmond Dene Real Tennis Club. Real Tennis is the original racket sport! RIBA information boards will be on display providing information about this fascinating building, revealing hidden facts and architectural titbits.

JESMOND Jesmond Parish Church

Eskdale Terrace NE2 4DJ

This grade II listed building was designed by John Dobson and opened in January 1861. Wood carving by Ralph Hedley and stained glass by George Baguley and Lawrence Lee. In addition to the opening for HODs, all are welcome to attend any of the Sunday services at: 9.30, 11.15 and 18.30.

JESMOND Newcastle Cricket Club

Jesmond Ground, Osborne Avenue NE2 1JS

Lots to see and do is on offer at the Cricket Club over the HODs weekend after which you can relax in the bar! There will be displays illustrating the 125 years of this historic Jesmond Ground along with special displays entitled 'Meet the Benefactors from 1887–2014'. Discovery Trail available.

JESMOND St George's Church

St George's Close, Osborne Road NE2 2TF

St George's was built in 1888–9 by Charles Mitchell, a local shipbuilder, who engaged his shipyard architect to design the building. It is an outstanding example of Victorian art and architecture. The interior is one of restrained magnificence. The glass, mosaics, carving and metalwork include rare Art Nouveau design which fit seamlessly into the traditional Neo Early English style.

98-100 Pilgrim Street NE1 6SQ

A rare chance to get inside this grade I listed, late 17th and early 18th century merchant's house. Fine panelled first floor room with decorative plaster ceiling. Beautifully restored by the Tyne & Wear Building Preservation Trust. Now in use as offices. Tea Owl will host a pop-up tea room.

NEWCASTLE Bessie Surtees House

41-44 Sandhill NE1 3JF

Visit these 16th and 17th century merchants' houses, fine examples of Jacobean domestic architecture. Now the North East office for English Heritage, the buildings boast some splendid period interiors and are best known as the scene of the elopement of Bessie with John Scott, later Lord Chancellor of England. On Saturday a cafe will be open in honour of an Edwardian resident business and a powerpoint presentation will display historic photographs of the house.

NEWCASTLE Brunswick Methodist Church

Brunswick Place NE1 7BJ

An 1820 grade II listed building and a fine example of early 19th century Wesleyan architecture. Brunswick succeeded the Orphan House as the mother church of Methodism in North-East England. The church will be open and will have historical documents on display including a Wesleyana display in the vestry which is not usually open to the public.

NEWCASTLE Cathedral Church of St Nicholas

St Nicholas Square, Mosley Street NE1 1PF

Displays will include: The Hexham Bible; copes; silver; and icons from the St Nicholas Icon Collection. There will also be a display of the work of Ralph Hedley, the 19th century craftsman responsible for the Choir. There will be timed ticketed tours of the Cathedral's iconic Lantern Tower. Those who wish to join a Tower Tour must be aged over 8 and be physically fit. Tickets for the Tower Tour will be available on each day of the event from 09.00 - for that day only. Guided tours of the Cathedral will also be available throughout the weekend.

The public areas of Central Square, remodelled from a former 1930s Post Office sorting house which had closed in 1995, and Central Square South, a contemporary office complex incorporating major artwork, will be open for general viewing.

NEWCASTLE Fabulous! LGBT Walking Tour

Lesbian and gay history often gets overlooked, forgotten or lost, but times are changing and (at least in Britain) the past lives of lesbians and gay men are now being researched, captured and recorded. Richard Bliss and Kate Sweeney have created a theatrical walking tour (approx 2 miles) for HODS 2014. The tour will make accessible the social and legislative frameworks that have surrounded lesbian and gay lives from the earliest beginnings of urban life. The tour uses performance, recordings and film to share undisputed facts with a peppering of fiction to imagine what gay life in Newcastle might have been like from the 16th to the 21st centuries.

NEWCASTLE Grainger Market

Grainger Street NE1 5QQ

Tours meet at the Grainger Market Inspector's Office, Alley 2

The Grainger Market, a grade I listed building, is a permanent covered market and has been at the heart of Newcastle life since 1835. It was part of the redevelopment of Newcastle by Richard Grainger and his architect John Dobson. At the time it sold mainly meat and vegetables. The market still retains its traditional feel and houses a number of unique features including a fish market, the world's smallest and oldest branch of Marks and Spencer which has traded since 1895 and the unique weigh-house.

NEWCASTLE Grey's Monument

Grey Street NE1 5BQ

Grey's Monument, erected in 1838 to commemorate Earl Grey and his contribution to the passing of the Great Reform Bill. Designed by Benjamin Green, the monument has a Roman Doric column of hard millstone grit 135 ft tall (50ft shorter than Nelson's Column), set on a base of local sandstone. It is topped with a limestone statue of Earl Charles Grey by the sculptor Edward Hodges Baily. A rare chance to climb the 164 steps to the top of the monument for outstanding views of the city. Reasonable fitness and sensible footwear are necessary.

NEWCASTLE Holy Jesus Hospital City Road NE1 2AS

A 17th century brick-built Almshouse, with adjoining 16th century Tudor Tower and 19th century soup kitchen, all built on the site of a 14th century Augustinian Friary, brought back to life with volunteer-led tours!


NEWCASTLE Laing Art Gallery – Isabella and the Pot of Basil




NEWCASTLE Live Theatre Tours
